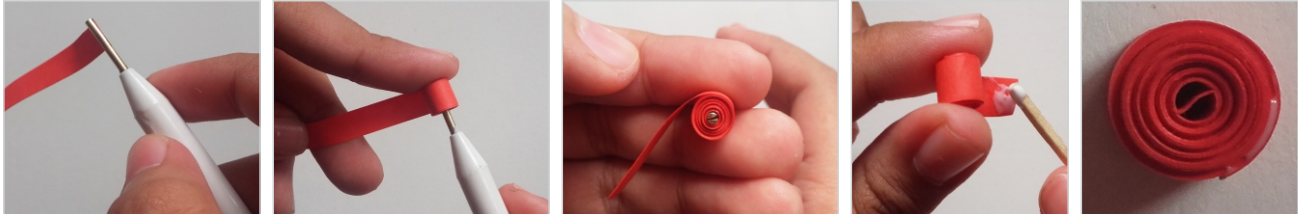


1) Tight coil



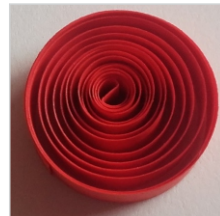
Insert the end of the paper into the slot of the quilling tool. Turn the slotted tool towards you. Place your thumb or index finger at the very tip of the slotted tool. This will prevent the paper from slipping off the tool. Use the other fingers to guide the strip of paper so that it rolls into an even plug (called a tight coil). When done, turn the slotted tool a quarter turn away from you. Pull the plug out of the slotted tool. Hint: the coil comes off the tool neatly if you pull the coil off the tool and not pull the tool out of the coil. Use a toothpick to apply a small smidgen of glue (not a part of the kit) onto the free end of the tight coil. Use your finger, a clean toothpick (not a part of the kit), or forceps (not a part of the kit) to press the free end onto the coil. When dry you will have a tight coil.

2) Loose coil

Make a tight coil & then release the coil from the tool and let it relax into a loose coil. After the coil has relaxed, apply glue and secure the loose end.



3) oval



Start off with a loose coil and gently press into the center to create an oval shape. Use light pressure.

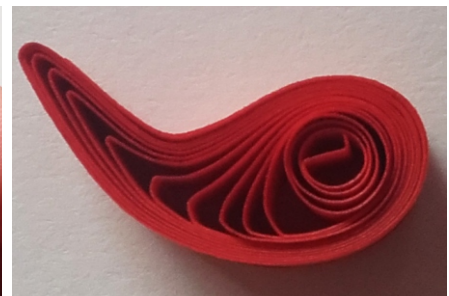
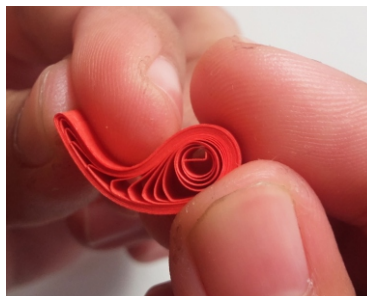
4) Tear Drop



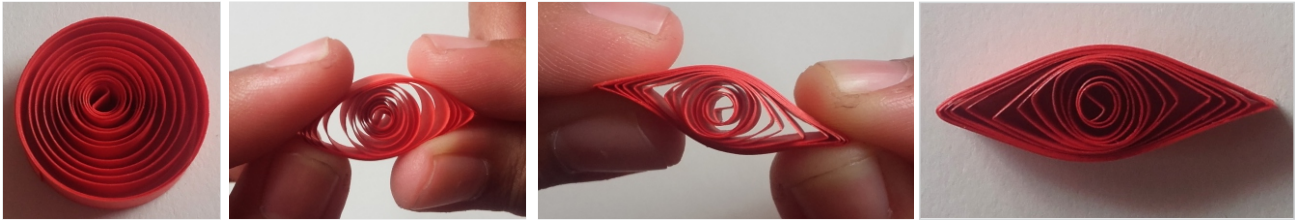
Make a loose coil and with the thumb & index finger pinch it together forming a shape with a point at one end and leaving the other end rounded. This is a useful shape for flower petals.

5) Petal or Curved Tear Drop

Taking your teardrop shape, gently press your pointed end to one side to curve it over.



6) Marquee or eye shape

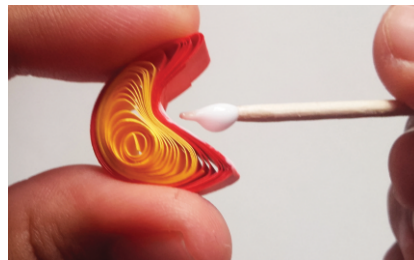
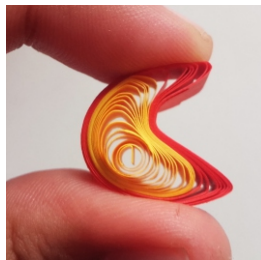


Take a loose coil and this time hold it between the thumb and index fingers of both hands. Pinch tightly with both hands to form points at each end. **The marquee is one of the most useful shapes in quilling.**

7) Bend Marquee

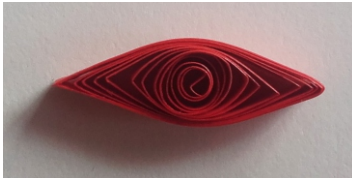


Make a marquee of two colors. Ref to section 6 above.



Bend it and glue two tips together. Hold it till dry & join.

8) Leaf / Shaped or Curved Marquee



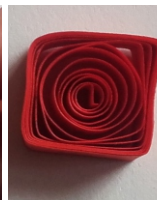
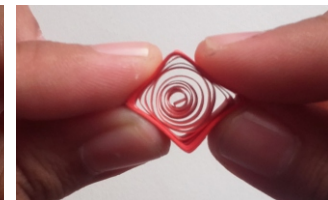
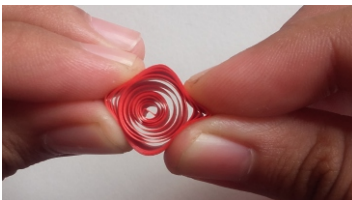
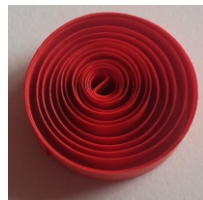
Make a marquee. Refer to section 6 Marquee



But this time after pinching the ends move them in opposite directions creating a twist in the shape.



9) Square

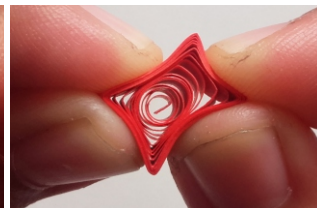
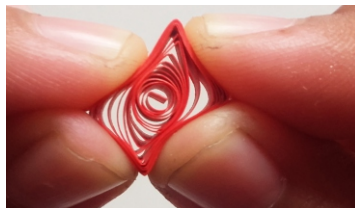


This one needs both thumbs and both index fingers. Hold the circle between all four digits & gently press into a square shape. Squeeze each corner to transform your circle into a square.

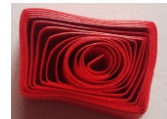
10) Rectangle



Make a marquee, refer to section 6

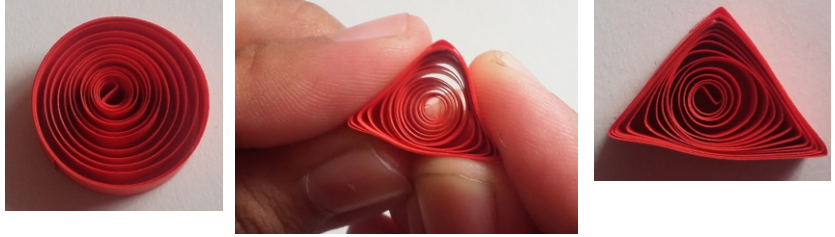


Rotate and pinch two more points. Then press toward the center to elongate.

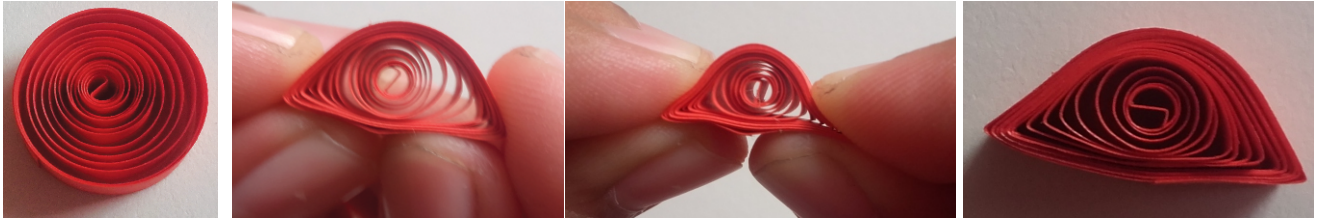


11) Triangle

Holding the circle between your index fingers of each hand, push the bottom of the circle up with your thumbs to create a triangle. Pinch the three corners to sharpen them up.

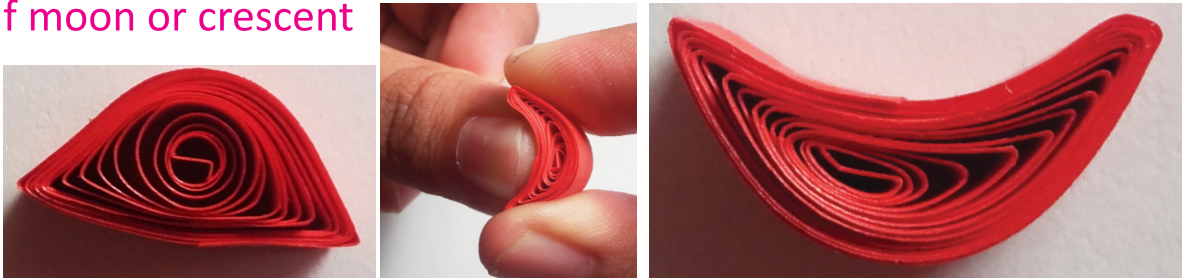


12) D Shape



Make a loose coil. Using both hands, form a half circle and pinch two ends. Careful press maintaining the curve.

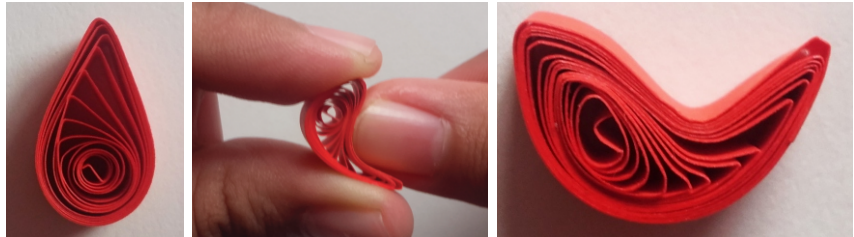
13) Half moon or crescent



Make a D-shape (refer to section 12 above) and with the ball of your thumb press in to create a crescent shape. You can press with handle or tool (not a part of this kit) as well.

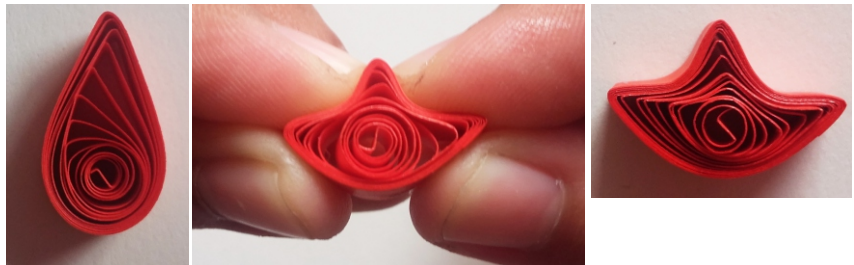
14) Bunny ear or shield

Make a teardrop (refer to section 4). With your nail, press in to create a dent and pinch another point to create a bunny ear.



15) Tulip or Duck foot

You start out with a teardrop(section 4). Same as the bunny ear you will pinch two extra points on either side of center of the teardrop. Use both hands to simultaneously push in and pinch up the two points.



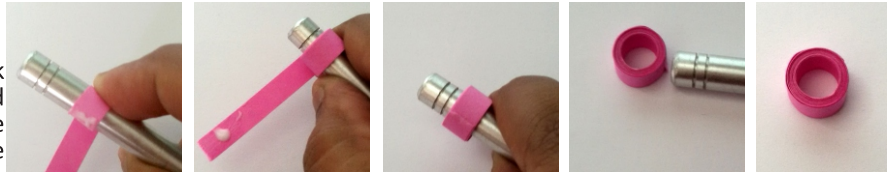
16) Arrow

Make a teardrop (refer to section 4). With your thumb or finger, press in to create a dent and Squeeze as shown to create an arrow



17) Ring Tight Coil

It is made by rolling a strip at the back part of the quilling tool or any round object. Stick the tip of the strip after the first coil. Then roll tightly and glue the end before sliding it out.

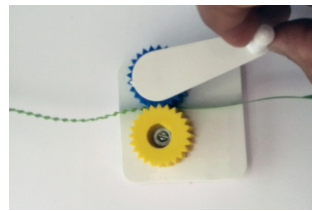
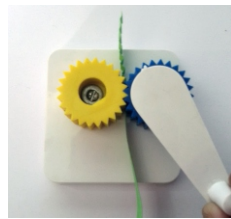


18) How to stick two strips together

Glue two strips together, overlapping slightly. Allow glue to dry. Can join same colors or different colors. Make sure after sticking you get a straight line of strip. *If need half strip then tear the strip by folding in required length.*



19) How to do Crimping



Insert the quilling paper between the wheels of the crimper tool.

Gently rotate using the handle. Now you will get the paper crimped.

When using crimped strips in needle, please give light pressure.

20) Fringed Flower

Use a thicker strip for these flowers 7mm. To cut the fringes one can use the Binder clip, Fringing scissors or simply scissors. Here we showing you how to make with simple scissors.



Hold the strip between two fingers and with opposite hand make small and close cuts on the strip of paper. To get the center of the flower, stick a thinner strip at beginning of the fringed cut strip.

Make a tight coil. Glue the end and then slide of the tool carefully.

Open the fringes to get your flower.

Tip: Draw a line with help of ruler at 5mm on the strip. this will help you in getting even length of fringes.

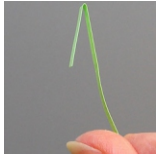
21) Grass

Take a strip fold it up and down. (zig- zag like a fan fold). On each bottom fold apply a tiny bit of glue with a toothpick to form a grass like shape. To gain stability make the last bottom fold wrap around the bottom.

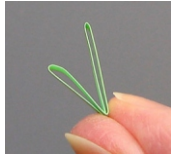


22) Husking - Fairy Wing / Leaf

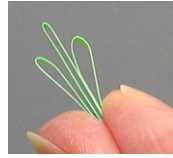
Technique used here is an alternate side looping technique called husking. Can be done on a comb or by hand as well. Make require to join a few strips for this technique



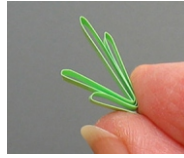
Begin by making a fold at one end of a quilling strip. This is the center of the Wing so keep length accordingly



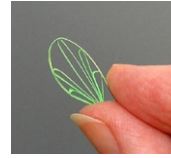
Next, make a loop to the left of the fold that isn't quite as tall as the fold.



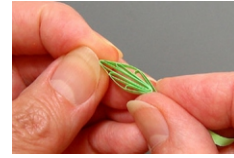
Make a second loop, this one to the right of the fold.



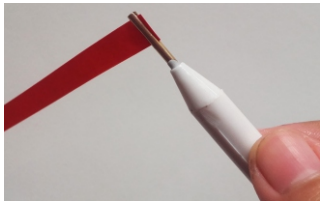
Make another pair of loops, not quite as tall as the first pair. Keep on doing the left / right looping till you get desired thickness.



Encircle all of the loops with the same continuous strip to create a collar. Glue end in place at the bottom of the leaf and trim excess paper.

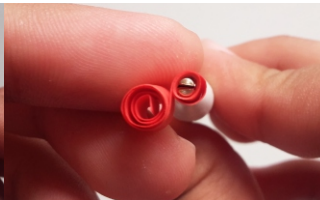
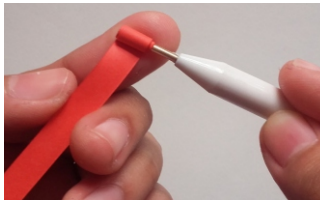


Pinch the tip



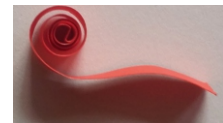
23) S - Scroll

Take a strip of paper and identify the midpoint (do not fold, just look). Roll the end of the paper towards the midpoint and then release the coil. Repeat with the other end of the paper. Arrange the coils so that they are the same size; shape the paper so it curves evenly.



24) Open-Scroll

Its very similar to S-Scroll except that in this you have to roll only one side of strip and release the coil. With the tool you can shape up the rest of strip in direction you want to curve.



Please ensure safety while using sharp objects like needle. Keep away from Infants. Adult supervision is a must. For kids of age group 7 & above only.

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
